



Dr. Sishodiya is a Medical Graduate (1977) from All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi. He completed his Masters' Degree in Occupational Hygiene from University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, UK in 1979.

Dr. Sishodiya worked as tutor, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, and Medical Officer (Surveillance), in Hyderabad Industries Ltd., Faridabad for eight years . He headed the Occupational Health Division of Directorate General of Mines Safety, as Deputy Director of Mines Safety (Occupational Health) for more than 18 years. Before joining National Institute of Miners' Health as Director he was providing consultancy services to various industries in Occupational Health and Hygiene.

He has been Resource Person for International Labour Organisation and World Health Organisation for training of medical officers in use of ILO International Classification of Chest Radiographs of Pneumoconiosis.

Dr. Sishodiya has presented more than 50 papers in national and international conferences on various aspects of asbestos monitoring and health issues, medical surveillance for pneumoconiosis, use of ILO International Classification in diagnosis of pneumoconiosis, causes of natural death at work, national programme for elimination of silicosis, noise induced hearing loss, etc..

Dr. Sishodiya was national President of Indian Association of Occupational Health for the year 2000 and has been member of American Industrial Hygiene Association, British Occupational Hygiene Society, Dust Advisory Panel, Asbestos International Association, UK; Institute of Occupational Hygienists, UK and Australian Institute of Occupational Hygienists, Australia.
